

Gen. O'Neill Inspecting Today 10,000 V.D. Troops Resume Camp Drum Field Training

The 101st Engineers under the command of Lt. Col. Stanley Bishop of Medford, spent the day on the banks of the Black River practicing the construction of pontoon bridges.

CAMP DRUM, N. Y.—After a week-end furloigh the 10,000 men of the 26th Yankee Division, Massachusetts National Guard, Monday returned to the serious business of training in the field.

The 164th Transportation Battalion was also at work on the river where new amphibious personnel carriers were operating. The soldiers observed techniques used by the vehicle crews in moving equipment over rough forest territory and along the swift flowing current of the river.

The 110th Armored Battalion moved 255 pieces of heavy artillery into bivouac areas and continued their intensive firing practice under observation.

At the same time a selected unit of 800 men of the First Battle Group of the 101st Infantry spent the day learning the intricacies of the river.
